## Scientist of the Year Announcement (January 21, 2025)

An international leader in the scientific study of microbes, **Rob Knight**, PhD, has been named the 2025 Scientist of the Year by the Achievement Rewards for College Students (ARCS) Foundation San Diego chapter.

Knight is a professor in the Departments of Pediatrics, Bioengineering, and Computer Science and Engineering at University of California San Diego as well as the Wolfe Family Endowed Chair in Microbiome Research at Rady Children's Hospital -San Diego. He is also a founding faculty member and professor in the Halicioğlu Data Science Institute.


Knight will be honored on April 13 at a special event hosted by the ARCS Foundation.

Known as a pioneer in the study of the roles that microbes play in human health and disease and the functioning of ecosystems, his work has linked microbes to a range of health conditions including obesity and inflammatory bowel disease, has enhanced our understanding of microbes in environments ranging from the oceans to the tundra, and made high-throughput sequencing techniques accessible to thousands of researchers around the world.

"The impact of microbes on human and environmental health is profound, and the San Diego chapter of ARCS is both honored and thrilled to have one of the world's leading microbiome researchers, Dr. Rob Knight, as our 2025 Scientist of the Year," said **Leslie Bruce**, president of the ARCS Foundation San Diego Chapter. "Not only has Dr. Knight contributed more than 900 scientific articles in the field, his lab has produced many vital software tools and laboratory techniques that enable the work of other researchers as well. Growing evidence suggests gut microbes also influence the brain, potentially affecting mood, behavior and psychiatric illnesses. By better understanding the microbial world Dr. Knight's work helps improve both human physical and mental health."

**Amanda Lee (2024-2025 ARCS Scholar at SDSU/UCSD)** shared the exciting news that her paper entitled "Evaluating the Benefit of Multi-phase CT and Clinical Data for Deep Learning-based COPD Staging," was accepted for publication in *Radiology: Cardiothoracic Imaging*, a specialty journal published by the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA).



Adrian Rivera (2021-2024 ARCS Scholar at SDSU) won a "Best Poster" award at SDSU's College of Engineering newly rebranded Graduate Research Symposium held on November 8 at the Conrad Prebys Aztec Student Union. Adrian's poster was entitled, "Effect of Manufacturing Imperfections in Sandwich Composites with Aluminum Honeycomb in Multi-Axial Loading."

### Scholar Alumni - Where Are They Now?

**Gabriel Simon, PhD (2007-2008, Scripps Research)** joined Vividion Therapeutics in 2017 to lead the Proteomics Platform group. Vividion is a clinical stage biopharmaceutical company that uses novel discovery technologies to unlock high-value, traditionally undruggable targets with precision therapeutics for devastating cancers and immune disorders. Vividion is a wholly owned and independently operating subsidiary of Bayer AG, with a new research and development (R&D) center and corporate headquarters in San Diego.



Dr. Simon's role at Vividion involves a dual focus on building and scaling a cutting-edge chemical proteomics screening group, as well as the creation and oversight of a unique and enabling proteo-informatic database called the Data Portal. The proteomics platform group supports nearly all stages of Vividion's drug discovery efforts and works closely with the early discovery group to identify and prioritize opportunities for development.

Dr. Simon has spent the majority of his scientific career developing proteomics methodologies and novel informatic tools to derive maximum insight from them. Prior to joining Vividion, Dr. Simon was an early employee at Abide Therapeutics where he developed gel- and mass-

spectrometry-based screening workflows for the discovery and characterization of covalentserine hydrolase inhibitors that are currently undergoing clinical exploration.

Dr. Simon was a graduate student with Vividion's co-founder Ben Cravatt at Scripps Research and performed postdoctoral research with Jeff Gordon at Washington University in St. Louis. He is an author or co-author of more than 30 scientific publications and three issued patents.

**Deron Herr, PhD (2004, SDSU/UCSD)** has been a Research Associate Professor at Sanford Burnham Prebys since April 2023, following a tenure as Senior Director of Biology at Ligature Therapeutics from July 2021 to March 2023. Dr. Herr previously held academic roles, including Associate Professor and Chief of Biochemistry at American University of Health Sciences, and served as Research Assistant Professor and Assistant Professor at the National University of Singapore.



Extensive experience also includes a position as Assistant Research Professor at San Diego State University, co-founding Expression Drug Designs to lead the development of drug candidates targeting lipid signaling systems, and a research associate role at Scripps Research, where studies focused on bioactive signaling lipids and pharmacodynamic research. Dr. Herr obtained a PhD in Cell and Molecular Biology through the SDSU/UCSD joint doctoral program, and a BS in Biology from Truman State University. He is happy to be back in San Diego, not only for the fantastic science, but also so he can go trail running and snowboarding again.

**Tari Gilbert, MSN, FNP-BC (2004-2006, USD)** is a board-certified family nurse practitioner (FNP-BC) whose clinical focus is caring for people living with or at risk for HIV/AIDS. She joined the Owen Clinic's\* staff in 2013, following more than 12 years of clinical HIV research, with focus on primary HIV infection, co-infection with HIV and hepatitis, and treatment adherence. Ms. Gilbert has expertise in providing gender-affirming care to transgender and nonbinary patients.



Known for her love of clinical work and dedication to teaching and patient advocacy, Ms. Gilbert brings more than 20 years of HIV experience to her work as a family nurse practitioner. In both her personal life and professional practice, she embraces an intersectional and collaborative worldview. Through this, she works with patients' strengths and seeks to build a community of healing.

Ms. Gilbert earned both her master's degree and bachelor's degree in nursing at University of San Diego, where she graduated with honors. She is certified by the American Nurses
